- -- writing software brings no academic credits
- -- statistics software should be language-standardized
- -- software should be reviewed
- -- statistics software should be known outside statistics
- -- replace JRSS-C
- -- various personal reasons

In order to make sure JSS is visible we made sure that:

- -- JSS got listed in CIS, Web of Science, DOAJ, the BibTeX Database, SCOPUS
- -- JSS was acknowledged as official ASA journal
- -- ASA registered the ISSN and CODEN numbers
- -- contents can be harvested by OAI/DC

The JSS *homepage* gets about 50,000 hits per year (five-year average).

The JSS *volumes* get about 4,000 hits per year.

The JSS *issues* get about 1,000 hits per year (although there is a huge variance).

Future

- -- Special (area centered) issues (psycho, socio, politico, econo, chemo, networks)
- -- Not forget about Matlab, Stata, SAS, SPSS
- -- Update interface (Ruby on Rails) and databases
- -- Make our own editorial system
- -- Advertise in various areas
- -- Coordinate with R News and JCGS
- -- Flesh out snippets, reviews
- -- Maximize the impact coefficient
- -- Improve the review process
